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20 **All potential bidders must be certified by DOA prior to submitting bids on state construction**
21 **projects over \$50,000.** All bids received from contractors who are not certified will be rejected. Contractor

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26 This project is being let using the single prime bidding and contracting process. DFD will publicly bid the
27 applicable mechanical, electrical, plumbing, and fire protection (MEP) divisions of work **first**. Within 5
28 days of the MEP bid opening, DFD will identify a lowest, qualified, responsible, certified bidder in each
29 applicable MEP division of work. These successful MEP bids must be included in all general prime
30 contractor bids received. No later than 5 days after DFD identifies the successful MEP bids, DFD will
31 publicly open general prime contractor bids. **General prime contractor bids that do not include the**
32 **successful MEP bids will be rejected.** The state will enter into a single contract with the lowest, qualified,
33 responsible, certified general prime contractor and this general prime contractor will enter into subcontracts
34 with the successful MEP bidders. If a project does not include any mechanical, electrical, plumbing, or fire
35 protection divisions of work, DFD will bid one bid package for all work to general prime contractors.

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55 This project is Phase II-02 of a 5 part Master Plan for this facility.

1 In general the work consists of the remodeling of approximately 1,645 GSF of the Milwaukee Army
2 National Guard Readiness Center.

3
4 **Project Background:**

5 The Milwaukee Army National Guard Readiness Center was constructed in 1927 and consists of
6 approximately 98,243 GSF. The building was originally designed as an Armory, Calvary Riding Hall and
7 Stables.

8 Renovations have continuously occurred since that time including;

9 Converting the riding hall and stables into a drill hall and miscellaneous administrative offices.

10 The Phase I renovation work (completed in Spring of 2020) - which included provision of a mechanical
11 room addition, provision of fire protection and fire alarm systems, replacement of hot water heating,
12 ventilating and air conditioning systems and equipment, and replacement of lighting, power, and
13 communications systems in the Administrative Wing of the building.

14 The Phase II basement renovation work (completed in July 2022) - which included provision remodeling of
15 the basement of the Administrative Wing, including new toilet and shower rooms.

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17 The scope of work for this Phase II-02 Contract includes;

18 The provision of a 3 stop elevator, hoistway and associated equipment within the existing building
19 footprint.

20 The provision of miscellaneous civil and site work to the grounds adjacent to the building.

21 The provision of replacement unit windows in the Administrative Wing.

22 The provision of MEP and FP work associated with the above described work.

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24 For information, subsequent Phase III work will include the provision of architectural renovation on the
25 first and second floors of the Administrative Wing and portions of the Drill Hall. Phase III work is
26 scheduled to start after completion of this Phase II-02 work.

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48 Contract offer and construction phase records will be processed electronically on the WisBuild™ DFD
49 Information System.

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52 **The 2017-2019 Wisconsin State Budget (2017 Wisconsin Act 59) repealed Wisconsin's prevailing**
53 **wage laws. Effective September 23, 2017, state prevailing wage requirements on state building**
54 **projects no longer apply. These changes take effect for projects advertised for bid after September**
55 **23, 2017. This change does not affect the Federal Davis Bacon Act requirements.**
