This project is partially funded by a Save America's Treasures Grant. This project will be conducted utilizing the <i>Secretary of the Interior</i>

1 Standards for Restoration. The existing building is a 2,385 sf, two-story, wood framed structure with a

2 basement and an attached one-story masonry vault that has a slab on grade. Removal of the non-historic

3 elements and restoration of the overall form of the building, including roof reconstruction, porch

4 alignments, masonry vault infills, window replacement, and custom siding replacement. Historic windows
