When 85% or more 27 of the construction cost of a project could be completed by a Single Trade Contractor (mechanical, 28 electrical, plumbing, or fire protection), the Department may bid and contract all work of that 29 construction project directly to a Single Trade Contractor. The State will enter into a single contract with the lowest, qualified, responsible, certified single trade MEP contractor. Single trade MEP 30 31 contractors may bid on single trade projects up to their current division of work certification level for 32 that trade. All Work for this project will be awarded to a single trade ELECTRICAL contractor. 33 Bidders shall submit a Single Base Bid for all Work. 34 35 Sealed bids will be received at the State of Wisconsin Administration Building, 7th Floor, 101 East Wilson 36 Street, Madison, Wisconsin 53703, before the time indicated above. The bidder is responsible for the sealed 37 bid being delivered to the indicated location for receipt stamping before the time specified for the bid opening. Third party delivery is entirely at the bidder's risk. 38 39 40 In general the work consists of replacing the existing Siemens MXL fire alarm system to a new Siemens 41 XLS system as well as replacing all existing detection devices at the Wisconsin State Capitol Building. The existing control panel enclosures will be gutted and reused for the new system. The existing 42 43 infrastructure of the system (Boxes, conduit, wiring, etc..) will be re-used. The project will be phased 44 to minimize outage of the fire alarm system. The building will be fully occupied throughout the 45 construction duration. 46 47 **CLASS 1 NOTICE:** 48 49 Notice is hereby given in accordance with Section 16.855(10), Wisconsin Statutes, that the Division 50 believes it is in the best interests of the State to contract the following work from only one source, 51 without the usual statutory procedures:

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Fire Alarm control panel and peripheral devices as stated in specification 28 31 00.

Bidders shall identify the division of work being bid when requesting Bidding Documents online. No deposit is required to obtain documents for bidding purposes. Bid Guarantee in the amount of 10% of the Bid must accompany each bid submitted. Contract offer, and construction phase records will be processed electronically on the WisBuild™ DFDM Information System. 

 The 2017-2019 Wisconsin State Budget (2017 Wisconsin Act 59) repealed Wisconsin's prevailing wage laws. Effective September 23, 2017, state prevailing wage requirements on state building projects no longer apply. These changes take effect for projects advertised for bid after September 23, 2017. This change does not affect the Federal Davis Bacon Act requirements.

A pre-bid Tour and Conference will be conducted at the site on December 19, 2019 at 9:00AM. Participants should meet at the building on the main level at the service desk in the rotunda area. Participants will be escorted throughout the building areas by facility staff. Bidders are highly encouraged to attend. No separate tours will be conducted.
