NOTICE: Effective January 1, 2014, all potential bidders must be certified by DOA <u>prior</u> to submitting bids on state construction projects over \$50,000. All bids received from contractors who are not certified will be rejected. Only bidders who have been certified by DOA as a qualified and responsible bidder in the ELECTRICAL division of work may bid on this project.

 This project is being let using a new single trade bidding and contracting process. When 85% or more of the construction cost of a project could be completed by a Single Trade Contractor (mechanical, electrical, plumbing, or fire protection), the Department may bid and contract all work of that construction project directly to a Single Trade Contractor. The State will enter into a single contract with the lowest, qualified, responsible, certified single trade MEP contractor. Single trade MEP contractors may bid on single trade projects up to their current division of work certification level for that trade. All Work for this project will be awarded to a single trade ELECTRICAL contractor. Bidders shall submit a Single Base Bid for all Work.

Sealed bids will be received at the State of Wisconsin Administration Building, 7th Floor, 101 East Wilson Street, Madison, Wisconsin 53703, before the time indicated above. The bidder is responsible for the sealed bid being delivered to the indicated location for receipt stamping before the time specified for the bid opening. Third party delivery is entirely at the bidder's risk.

In general the work consists of replacing the obsolete theatrical dimming system and associated lighting outlets and wiring. Project work includes three components: (1) Replacing network switching equipment, (2) Replacing surface-mounted outlet boxes, and (3) Replacing dimming racks. Network switching and dimming equipment in the performance space will be replaced with two new networks for better house control. New connection panels and interface equipment will also be installed, including a stage manager panel for DMX gateway, LCD control station, symphony lighting controls, and dedicated emergency/panic stations. A new control rack will replace the existing rack. Supply control receptacle panels will include booth control, house mix control, and three separate stage controls. Thirteen new control receptacle panels are included. Ninety-five (95) surface-mounted outlet boxes with varying pin connectors and other Edison type duplex outlets, outlet panels for the spot booth, as well as 50-foot multi-cable extensions, will be replaced. The house dimming equipment will be replaced with five new dimmer racks and dimmer modules with vibration mounts, two echo relay panels with main breakers, and required equipment.

Effective September 23, 2017, state prevailing wage requirements on state building 19 20 projects no longer apply. These changes take effect for projects advertised for bid after September 21 23, 2017.
